The Objective portion of your clinical note is observable data or information that coincides with the subjective statement. Typically this includes the client's body language and affect. The Assessment is your professional and clinical judgment based on the aforementioned Subjective and Objective statements.

Psychotherapy notes excludes medication prescription and monitoring, counseling session start and stop times, the modalities and frequencies of treatment furnished, results of clinical tests, and any summary of the following items: Diagnosis, functional status, the treatment plan, symptoms, prognosis, and progress to date. 45 CFR 164.501.

Progress Notes and Psychotherapy Notes

Psychotherapy notes, also called process or private notes, are notes taken by a mental health professional during a session with a patient. Psychotherapy notes usually include the counselor's or psychologist's hypothesis regarding diagnosis, observations and any thoughts or feelings they have about a patient's unique situation.

Progress Notes Vs. Psychotherapy Notes | Key Differences

For clinical professionals, SOAP notes offer a clear, concise picture of where the client is at the time of each session. They contribute to the continuity of care and are a tool for risk management and malpractice protection. For the client, they provide documentation of their problem, diagnosis, treatment options, and plans.

These categories typically include contact information, your client's presenting problem, your assessment, treatment and plan. In addition to free form notes, there are at least four common ways to standardize and record this information. They are: SOAP Notes, DA (R)P Notes, BASIC SID Notes,

How To Take Clinical Notes - Tamara Suttle

These notes, which capture the psychologist's impressions about the patient and can contain information that is inappropriate for a medical record, are similar to what psychologists have historically referred to as "process notes."
