Most primary teachers differentiate reading instruction through guided reading (Fountas & Pinnell, 2001). However, the landscape often changes when students enter fourth grade. Studies show that these students' personal reading lives and their delight in reading start to wane, and by middle school, they read less on their own than they did in the early grades (Ruddell & Unrau, 1997).
