To cite a direct quote in APA, you must include the author's last name, the year, and a page number, all separated by commas. If the quote appears on a single page, use "p."; if it spans a page range, use "pp." An APA in-text citation can be parenthetical or narrative.

General rules: • Do not use long quotations - they can never replace your own analysis. • When quoting from the text, always explain the quotation in your own words. • Do not overdo it - a few carefully selected quotations are certainly more worth than a text that contains quotations only.

How to Quote From a Text

Place the last name of the quoted author in parenthesis following the end of the quotation if you do not provide a name in the text as a citation. For example, instead of writing John Doe's name, you might write the following: The data was found to be accurate. (Doe) Include the book's page number from which you took the quote.

Paraphrase - Take the information from a specific sentence, paragraph, or section of the chapter and rewrite it in your own words. Summarize - Take a larger view of the section or the chapter and rewrite it in your own words. Quote - Use the exact words written by the author and enclose the words in quotation marks.

Basic book citation format The APA in-text citation for a book includes the author's last name, the year, and (if relevant) a page number. In the reference list, start with the author's last name and initials, followed by the year. The book title is written in sentence case (only capitalize the first word and any proper nouns).

Place the in-text citation after the quotation marks. For quotations at the end of the sentence, write the in-text citation after the quotation marks and before the period. Page number is preceded by p. for only one page and pp. for two or more pages. Include the abbreviated word para. before the paragraph number for works without pagination.

Place the title in quotation marks if it's a short work (such as an article) or italicize it if it's a longer work (e.g. plays, books, television shows, entire Web sites) and provide a page number if it is available.

MLA In-Text Citations: The Basics // Purdue Writing Lab

For a direct quotation, always include a full citation (parenthetical or narrative) in the same sentence as the quotation, including the page number (or other location information, e.g., paragraph number). Place a parenthetical citation either immediately after the quotation or at the end of the sentence.
