15 Useful Reading Strategies for Primary Learners

Use task cards with written and visual information. Use newspapers, magazines, and web sites in assignments (utilize your librarians). Avoid testing exclusively in English since students may not be able to demonstrate their learning in a second language. Provide sentence frames where appropriate.

Teaching Strategies for English Language Learners

If the sentence lacks information, students are encouraged to look at the previous and subsequent sentences. Teaching students to identify cognates, or words with common word derivation, between or across languages can be useful for determining meaning (e.g., August et al., 2009; Lesaux et al., 2010).

Decode and spell that word. Incorporate new words into discussions and activities. For students to really know a word, they must use it—or they will lose it. Use new words in class discussions or outside of class, in other contexts such as on field trips.
