Identify and introduce members of the health care team. Orient to area lay out, bathroom locations. Ensure orientee is included in meals and conversations. Orient to the practice area culture , i.e., breaks, how to ask for and offer help, events, etc. Model/coach effective communication with diverse coworkers.

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Traditional nursing orientation typically consists of 3 to 5 days of "information overload" in an effort to comply with hospital policies and regulations from the state and regulatory organizations such as The Joint Commission. Nursing orientation also introduces newly hired nurses to the hospital's medical records and information systems.
