and then select Clone Stamp Tool. You can then adjust the brush size and shape, opacity, flow, and blending modes in the tool options bar at the top of the workspace. If you want to copy an exact area, leave the opacity, flow, and blending mode at their default settings.

Photoshop makes the selection using the contrast between adjacent pixels. It seeks well-defined borders to make the selection. Sometimes, if there are no definitive borders, Photoshop ends up selecting a part of the background. You can always click on the Alt (in PC) or Option (in Mac) to subtract an unwanted selection.
