Aeschylus' most famous and perennially successful masterpiece, the tetralogy of plays comprising Agamemnon, The Libation Bearers (in Greek, Choephoroi), The Eumenides, and the satyr-drama Proteus, won first prize in the Athenian tragedy competition of 458 BCE. The three tragedies are the only connected trilogy to have survived from antiquity.

Originally the Oresteia consisted of four plays -Agamemnon, The Libation Bearers, The Eumenides and Proteus. The last was a satyr-play, completing the full 'tetralogy' dramatists composed. It would have presented gods and heroes in a comic situation that relieved the tensions of the tragedies while illuminating them with fresh perspectives.
